

We Didn't Know What Was Coming, But God Did

Covenant Presbyterian Church in Springfield, Ohio Ministers to Its Community, Including Its Haitian Siblings

The eyes of the world have been on Springfield, Ohio, following untrue allegations that members of the city's Haitian community had been capturing and eating other people's pets. At least 33 bomb threats have been made in recent days, all of them hoaxes, and schools and universities have been using online education to keep students, educators and staff safe.

"We didn't know what was coming, but God did," said the Rev. Jody Noble, pastor of Covenant Presbyterian Church in Springfield, who has taken on, among other important tasks over the past few days, organizing and offering a press conference featuring her colleagues in ministry.

PDA Responds to Hurricane Helene

Hurricane Helene made landfall in Florida late evening on September 26 as a very dangerous category 4 hurricane. The impact of Helene has been felt across multiple states. With the storm surge, wind damage, and flooding, it is crucial to have the necessary resources to support the many communities that are affected. Helene caused devastating damage in Florida, Georgia, South Carolina, North Carolina, and Tennessee.

Presbyterian Disaster Assistance (PDA) is in communication with FLAPDAN (Florida PDA Network), the Synod of the South Atlantic, SC PDAT (South Carolina PDA Team), Western North Carolina Presbytery, Holston Presbytery, and National VOAD (Voluntary Organizations Active In Disaster) to share information and coordinate resources as damage is assessed.

PDA has deployed a National Response Team to Tampa Bay Presbytery and Western North Carolina Presbytery.

Damage Sustained at Montreat

On Friday, September 27, Lake Susan and Flat Creek in the heart of Montreat Conference Center, swelled to historic levels following heavy rainfall brought on by Hurricane Helene. High water levels caused catastrophic flooding throughout the town of Montreat.

In addition, high winds brought down trees and power lines, contributing to widespread outages of power and water. Communication is limited due to regional phone outages. It has been reported that everyone onsite is safe, and that conference center buildings and structures, including the Lake Susan Dam, remain intact.
